External Examinations

This year, students in Year 12 sat for both the WASSCE and NECO examinations. Also, 49 students of year 9 class sat for both the NECO BECE and state BECE examinations. WASSCE results has been released and to the Glory of God the students' performance was impressive. We are also optimistic that our students will come out in flying colours in their NECO SSCE. Furthermore, all students who sat for this year's JAMB UTME performed well. None of them scored below 200. Aderounmu Iteoluwa scored 288 while Soyoye Jedidah scored 278.
